### ***COURSE DESCRIPTION:***

This program is designed for treatment teams wishing to optimize esthetic and functional implant-based restorations. Emphasis will be placed on contemporary clinical procedures, including esthetic risk and TEAM coordination. Implant morphology (tissue and bone level, and surface options) will be updated along with indications. Abutment and restoration options will be identified and related directly to metal and all-ceramic restorative choices, including CAD/CAM. Loading protocols for completely and partially edentulous patients will be discussed, along with the current level of evidence for treatment recommendations.

## ***EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES:***

At the completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Identify esthetic parameters and relate these to treatment risk.
- Choose the appropriate implant and abutment for individual implant restorations.
- Communicate the desired implant position through effective use of templates for tissue and bone level implants.
- Discuss the biologic basis for bone and esthetic tissue response.
- Fabricate contoured provisional restorations and customized impression copings on implants at tissue level or at bone level.
- Describe restorative options and discuss the influence of these on treatment outcome.
- Understand CAD/CAM technologies and their expanding role in implant treatments.
- More effectively incorporate esthetic procedures into their dental implant practice.
- Describe indications for accelerated treatment protocols.
- Discuss multidisciplinary assessment and implant selection for a range of treatment indications.

## ***ABOUT THE SPEAKER:***

Dean Morton, BDS, MS, is a Professor and Interim Chair of the Department of Oral Health and Rehabilitation at the University of Louisville School of Dentistry. He also serves as Assistant Dean for Multidisciplinary Implant and Esthetic Dentistry. Dr. Morton is a Diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics and is a Fellow of the American College of Prosthodontists, the International College of Dentists and the International Team for Implantology (ITI). He is a consultant to the ADA Commission on Dental Accreditation, and is a reviewer for several scientific publications including the *Journal of Periodontology* and the *Journal of Prosthodontics*. Dr. Morton has authored or co-authored more than 40 scientific articles. He was the primary author of the *ITI Treatment Guide, Vol. 2, Loading Protocols in Implant Dentistry* and a contributing author of the *ITI Treatment Guides, Vol. 1 and 4*. Dr. Morton lectures both nationally and internationally on implants and esthetic dentistry. He maintains a practice limited to Implant and Esthetic Dentistry and Prosthodontics at the University of Louisville School of Dentistry.
