

1st Annual Straumann Distinguished Speaker Lecture Accelerated Implant and Restorative Dentistry

Course Objectives

This clinical, usable information-packed presentation will address the close interaction of the implant surgeon with the restorative dentist and the dental laboratory in achieving optimal esthetic outcomes. Dr. Levine will emphasize the "Team Approach" to the most challenging implant and dental reconstruction procedures and "smile makeovers" involving the careful diagnosis and management of soft and hard tissues and their appropriate sequence in therapy when insufficiencies exist. Treating patients comprehensively using the oral plastic surgeon as a key in the complex prosthetic and esthetic reconstructions will be emphasized. In addition, SameDay Smile® cases of immediately loaded arches and single teeth will be discussed with guidelines for usage of this life changing therapy for our patients, which Dr. Levine has been performing in private practice since 1994. The use of chemically activated implant surfaces, bioactive proteins (Emdogain®), bone level implants and decreased loading protocols will be reviewed.

Learning Objectives

- Demonstrate systematic diagnosis and treatment planning with proper sequence of therapy in complex esthetic implant reconstructions with emphasis on esthetic risk assessment.
- Discuss clinical procedures that are pro-active for determining esthetic-restorative outcomes in areas of available and deficient bone requiring GBR.
- Discuss soft tissue management that includes various root coverage procedures and gummy smile correction as a preprosthetic procedure.
- Discuss "Pearls" for esthetic zone placement, including immediate implant placement and immediate restoration and immediate loading (SameDay Smile).
- Review usage of regenerative products such as Emdogain in regenerative therapies

Dr. Robert A. Levine maintains a full time private practice in Northeast Philadelphia focusing on Implant Surgical Placement, Cosmetic Oral Plastic Surgery Procedures and Regenerative Therapy. He is presently a Clinical Professor in Post-Graduate Periodontics and Oral Implantology at the Temple University Kornberg School of Dental Medicine and a Clinical Associate Professor in Post-Graduate Periodontics, Perio-Prosthesis and Implantology at the University Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine. Dr. Levine is a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology and has lectured extensively both nationally and internationally. He has authored over

50 articles, has contributed to 6 text books and serves on the editorial boards of numerous scientific dental journals. Dr. Levine is Fellow of the International Team for Implantology (ITI) of Basel, Switzerland and a Fellow of the College of Physicians in Philadelphia. In August, 2008, Dr. Levine was one of 100 representatives from around the world invited to participate in the ITI 4th Consensus Conference in Stuttgart, Germany to create treatment protocols for implant dentistry. He was recently (2009) inducted by Temple University to the Gallery of Success for the Kornberg School of Dentistry and in June, 2010 was honored as the Distinguished Speaker at the UNC Department of Periodontology's 13th Annual Straumann Lecture Series on Dental Implants.
