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rom the moment a patient steps through the doorway of The Pennsylvania Center for Dental Implants and Periodontics' office in Northeast Philadelphia, they feel welcome, safe, like a family member. They also know they are in the highly capable hands of some of the area's most gifted dental professionals.

Led by founder Robert A. Levine, D.D.S., FCPP, FISPPS, and partner Philip L. Fava II, D.M.D., MDSc, The Pennsylvania Center for Dental Implants and Periodontics specializes in the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of periodontal disease, as well as the surgical placement of dental implants. The practice offers a number of state-of-art art innovations designed to deliver successful patient outcomes, including LANAP (laser-assisted new attachment procedure) surgical therapy for use in treating periodontitis and pinhole grafting for treating gum recession.

"Periodontics is a technical specialty of saving teeth and placing implants," says Dr. Levine, who received certification in periodontology at the University of Pennsylvania. "Phil and I are plastic surgeons of the mouth, and we do extremely detailed and precise surgery."

The team of 15 professionals supporting Drs. Levine and Fava has a keen understanding of the synergic relationship between oral health and overall wellness. Together they offer the highest level of care and expertise in serving the practice's core mission: to enhance each patient's smile, both aesthetically and functionally, while improving their overall health and well-being.

Dr. Levine, who founded the practice in 1987, has become a clinician of local, national and international acclaim. Growing up in a close-knit family on Long Island, N.Y., Dr. Fava learned his strong work ethic while working in the family scrap-metal business. The experience taught him lessons about exceeding expectations and the value of a full day's work.

"I was really lucky to have had parents who taught me the lessons I needed for a happy life—putting others before yourself, self-discipline, and freedom in your work," Dr. Fava says. "If you get that when you are young, you never lose sight of it."

Before heading to medical school, he spent some time with his orthodontist, where he had his "aha" moment: "It became clear to me that this is what I was called for—working with my hands, developing meaningful relationships, and running a team."

Dr. Fava earned his Doctor of Dental Medicine degree from the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine in Philadelphia. He completed his specialty residency in periodontics and earned a Master's in Dental Science at the University of Connecticut. During his time at UConn, Dr. Fava served as the chief resident, which he considered a great honor and responsibility.

"My aim was always to go into or build a practice where I was going to put my all into caring for people, as opposed to only treating patients," Dr. Fava says. "Providing uncompromising, optimal treatment was always a given. That is a direct outcome of excellent training, continued learning, documentation and team focus. I believe that caring for people requires even more from you, and our practice is built for both."

Considering their shared expertise and commitment to excellence, it's no surprise that Drs. Levine and Fava have earned honors that include numerous "Top Dentists" awards, as published in respected publications such as *Philadelphia* magazine. Recently they brought 17 dental students to an orphanage in Peru, where they provided free dental services to orphans who would not otherwise have had access to such care.

Although the family-like environment is an essential aspect of The Pennsylvania Center for Dental Implants and Periodontics, Dr. Fava knows patients come to the practice for one reason above all others: the expertise of skilled, board-certified surgeons who excel at providing exceptional results.
